An Alter-Ego: A Dyadic Relationship

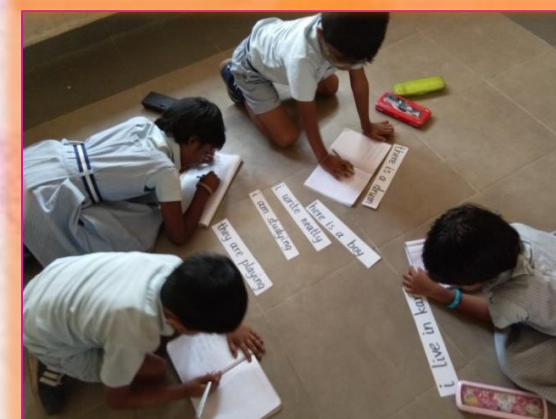


CVM's attempt to create an egalitarian society was on its zenith on Friendship Day. K.G. students were industrious in making friendship day bands.
