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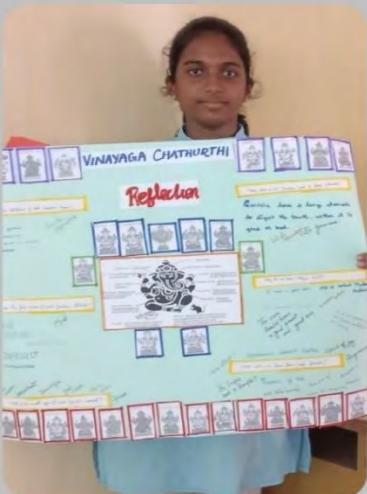
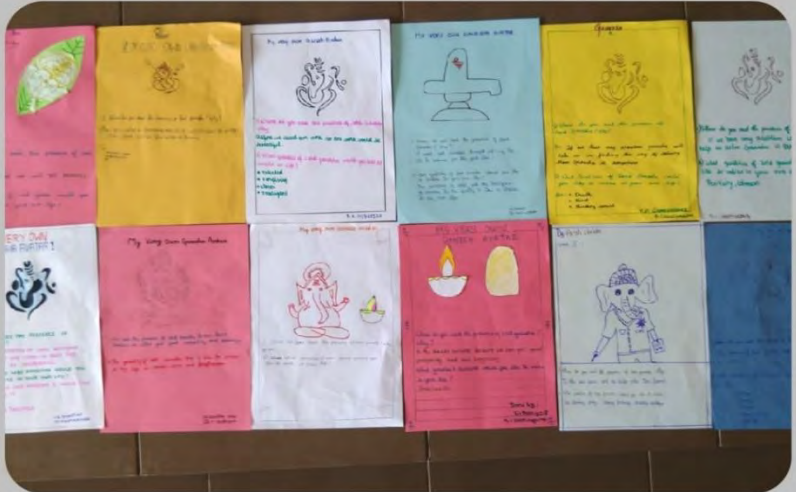

Teachers' day was organised by the student council. The best friend and trendy musical chair were some of the games they organized. Students conducted classes for their juniors.

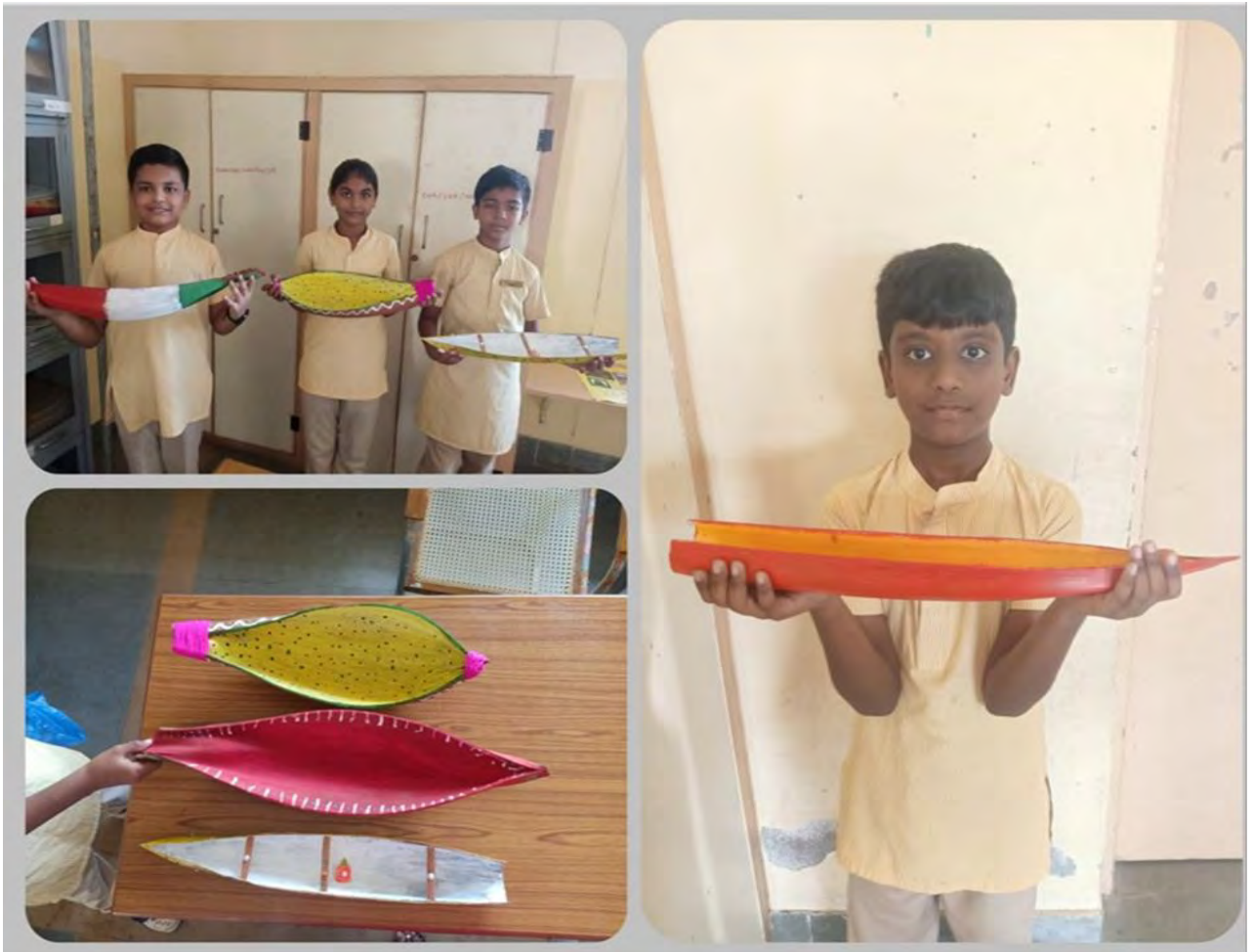
Onam Celebration

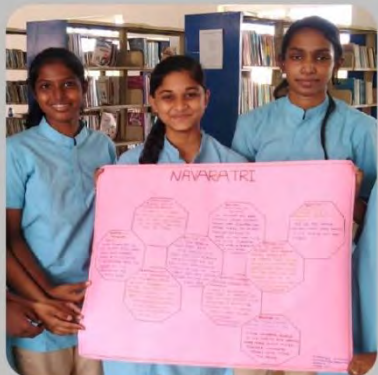




Navaratri Celebration
