


CBSE South Zone Cricket Tournament Success

Word Walk Adventure










Digital Drawing








Zoom into Characters! – Exploring Personalities




Role Play


Pure mathematics is, in its way, the poetry of logical ideas




Young Voices for Resource Conservation








Reading Log: Exploring the World of Tamil Stories














Trust Walk - Mini Role Play







Concept Map

Backpack Challenge: Carrying Values for Life






















"Quiz Time" at the High School Library - A Fun Way to Learn!














Poetry Fun at the Primary Library
























Passion Club Activity - Health and Hygiene






Creative Reuse

A Transformative Journey

Teachers who love teaching, teach children to love learning. Never in my life, did I imagine that I would become a teacher, forget about actually being so passionate and dedicated to this profession! Now when I look back, it has been an amazing journey full of growth and contentment.



Having studied in a traditional school, my idea of teaching was teacher centric where classrooms were quiet without any interaction. Turn in the assignments on time and don't ask too many questions, you will survive! In hindsight, I realised that school did not facilitate joyful learning. During class, I was extremely scared to speak my mind or ask questions for I worried about being humiliated or considered stupid. Moreover, everyone expected me to be perfect and good. This made me anxious and I didn't feel safe enough to make mistakes.

When I joined as a teacher in CVM, I thought teaching would be effortless and straight forward. I prepare for class and teach; children will listen and learn. But this was far from reality. Although children were smart and intelligent, they were fidgety and would pay attention in spurts. However, when they paid attention, they would ask unexpected questions that left me feeling embarrassed at my incapacity to think of a response. Moreover, in a class of multilevel learners, reaching out to each and every child was a huge challenge for me. I realised that I needed a complete overhaul of my idea of education.

The first thing I did was observe the children, their behaviours, actions and interactions; then I listened to them, their stories, problems and perspectives. Most of the children were intelligent and uniquely talented in their own ways. Some students were highly kinesthetic or artistic, while others were capable at logical reasoning. In order to help them flourish, I modified my teaching strategies to include more activity-based learning, conducting peer and group tasks, brainstorming and discussion. Additionally, I understood the importance of freedom of thought and expression, choices and humour and practiced these as a part of my teaching style.

Even though I changed my perspective of education, intentional practice took years of determined and consistent work. I often felt overwhelmed and exhausted! However, all this is worth it, when I see children learning joyfully and build trusting relationships with me. Changes are permanent in life, also in teaching; but now I enjoy this process of learning and unlearning.



The Art of Teaching: Treating and Teaching Hand in Hand

A short note to my teaching community around the world.

As educators, we often focus on imparting knowledge, but we should not forget that every child is unique, with their own strengths and weaknesses. There may be a child in the last bench who struggles to understand the genius of Ramanujan and Shakespeare, but excels in the creative kingdom of Picasso. It's high time we recognize that learning is a challenge for students of all ages, given the numerous distractions in today's world, such as social media, malls, and television.

In this era of distractions, it's not only learners who face challenges, but also educators.

Capturing students' attention and keeping them engaged is an overwhelming task. As teachers, we need to acknowledge that treating and teaching are interrelated. If students don't feel valued, supported, and cared for, their brains will naturally shut off, and whatever we teach will be like pouring water into an inverted glass – everything will go to waste.

I firmly believe that learners behave well when they have the right teachers. Unfortunately, some educators tend to take on the role of entrepreneurs who brand their product rather than educators. They focus on branding students as "naughty" or "problematic," rather than understanding and addressing their individual needs. This approach can be disheartening and detrimental to a child's learning journey.

What's more important than teaching is how we treat our students' emotions, celebrate their successes, and address their anxiety. When we prioritize their emotional well-being, we create a safe and supportive learning environment. This approach allows students to flourish and reach their full potential. We can unlock the true potential of our students and help them become lifelong learners.

Let's rediscover the art of teaching and prioritize treating our students with care and empathy. Let me conclude with a short poem:

In the eyes of a teacher,

Every little soul is a living question mark,

They are dare, but they always care,

If you show them how to share.

There are Miltons, there are Picassos, there are Armstrongs, Let's discover, let's be educators,

Rather than entrepreneurs.
