








"I" Vowel Sound Activity

Successful Soft Launch of the Workbook and Journal



A Recipe - The Cake of Life Success

This recipe makes one gloriously messy, perfectly imperfect, and surprisingly delicious life.

Ingredients:

The Dry Mix (The Foundation):

- 2 cups of All-Purpose Ambition (Sifted three times to remove any lumps of "I'll do it tomorrow").
- 1 1/2 cups of Finely Ground Failure (The secret ingredient! It adds a surprising depth of flavour and ensures the final product isn't too brittle. Must be ground fine; nobody likes big, bitter chunks).
- 1 tsp of Baking Soda Confidence (Just a little, too much will make it rise too fast and collapse dramatically).
- 1/2 cup of "I Don't Know Yet" Flour (Crucial for flexibility; don't substitute with "I Know Everything" self-rising flour—it's heavy and results in a dense, unchangeable cake).
- A pinch of Salted Critique (To balance the sweetness, but seriously, just a pinch. Don't let it overpower the batter).

The Wet Mix (The Glue):

- 3 large Eggs of Effort (Must be well-beaten until frothy; no shortcuts here).
- 1 cup of Unsweetened Time (Must be added slowly and deliberately; never rush this step).
- 1/4 cup of Melted, Unfiltered Honesty (A little messy, but it holds everything together).
- 1/4 cup of The Willingness to Look Ridiculous (Replaces the boring vanilla extract).

Instructions:

- Preheat your Mind to a sustainable 350-degree Fahrenheit. Too hot, and you'll burn out. Too low, and you'll never get started.
- In a large bowl, whisk together the Dry Mix ingredients. Take a moment to really appreciate the smell of Failure; it's the smell of lessons learned!
- In a separate bowl, gently combine the Wet Mix. The Unfiltered Honesty may cause a slight sizzle when meeting the Effort; this is normal.
- Pour the Wet Mix into the Dry Mix. Fold the batter very gently. Do not overmix! Overmixing creates a tough, resentful cake that refuses to admit when it's wrong. Stop the moment the ingredients are combined, even if there are a few streaks of "I Don't Know Yet" remaining.
- Fold in the Mix-Ins. Distribute the Chocolate Chips of Celebration unevenly so you have something to look forward to at every stage.
- Pour the batter into an ungreased, slightly crooked pan (because life isn't a perfectly straight line).
- Bake for 40 to 50 years, or until a toothpick of Self-Reflection inserted into the center comes out mostly clean. Don't worry if it's a little crumbly; that just means it's homemade.
- Cool completely on a wire rack of Perspective. Do not try to frost it while it's hot, or the Icing of Happiness will melt right off. A dusting of Kindness and Gratitude for an extra sparkle.
- Now our recipe "The Cake of Life Success" is ready for lifetime tasting.

Karur's Famous "Garam"

It was around 4 O'clock in the evening, when my son and I were craving a snack. For most localities, their preferred evening snack is "Garam". So, we journeyed on my scooty to the Ranganathan Garam Stall, on Kacherripillayar street. The stall is open from 9 am to 8:30 pm, but is bustling with people from 5:30 onwards.



"Garam" is a variety of chaat, which is unique to Karur and Salem.

According to culinary anthropologist Kurush Dalal,"chaat" is said to have been originated in northern India during the late 17th century. However, "Garam" gained popularity in Karur during 1960s. The ingredients are puffed rice mixed with grated carrots, beetroots and roasted groundnuts. This is blended with a coconut chutney and sour Mango chutney.

Finally, some crispy tattu-vadaai is crushed and added to it. A combination of these different ingredients gives a crunchy, spicy, sour and sweet taste which is top notch. There are many variations of this dish, the most popular one's are tattu vadaai set, samosa garam and bonda garam. Some shops are coming up with crazy variations like mayonnaise garam!

Ranganathan Garam Stall is one of the oldest places to eat this snack in Karur. The small shop sells an impressive variety of garam and other traditional snacks like Seempaal, kadalai mittai, Then mittai, Thenkuzhal etc. Each plate of Garam costs around 20 to 30 rupees.



I ordered a Boonda Garam and my son ordered a Pori Garam. Being a passionate cook, I tried making garam several times at home, however, I couldn't replicate the taste of the garam made in this shop. We then went on to order a Sweet set, Thayir set and Ellada Set. The Thayir Set was crunchy and spicy with the added flavor of curd gave a refreshing taste in the mouth. Visiting a Garam stall is a complete treat for our senses. It is

enjoyable to eat Garam, to watch the speed and style with which they make it. My family and I keep eating this snack over and over again. If you have a chance to visit Karur I recommend everyone taste Garam and experience the same.
